5. ANGER-IN (AX/In): An 8-item anger expression scale which measures the frequency with which angry feelings are held in or suppressed.

Persons with high AX/In scores frequently experience intense angry feelings, but they tend to suppress these feelings rather than expressing them either physically or in verbal behavior. It should be noted, however, that some persons who are high in anger-in may also express their anger in some situations and suppress it in others.
